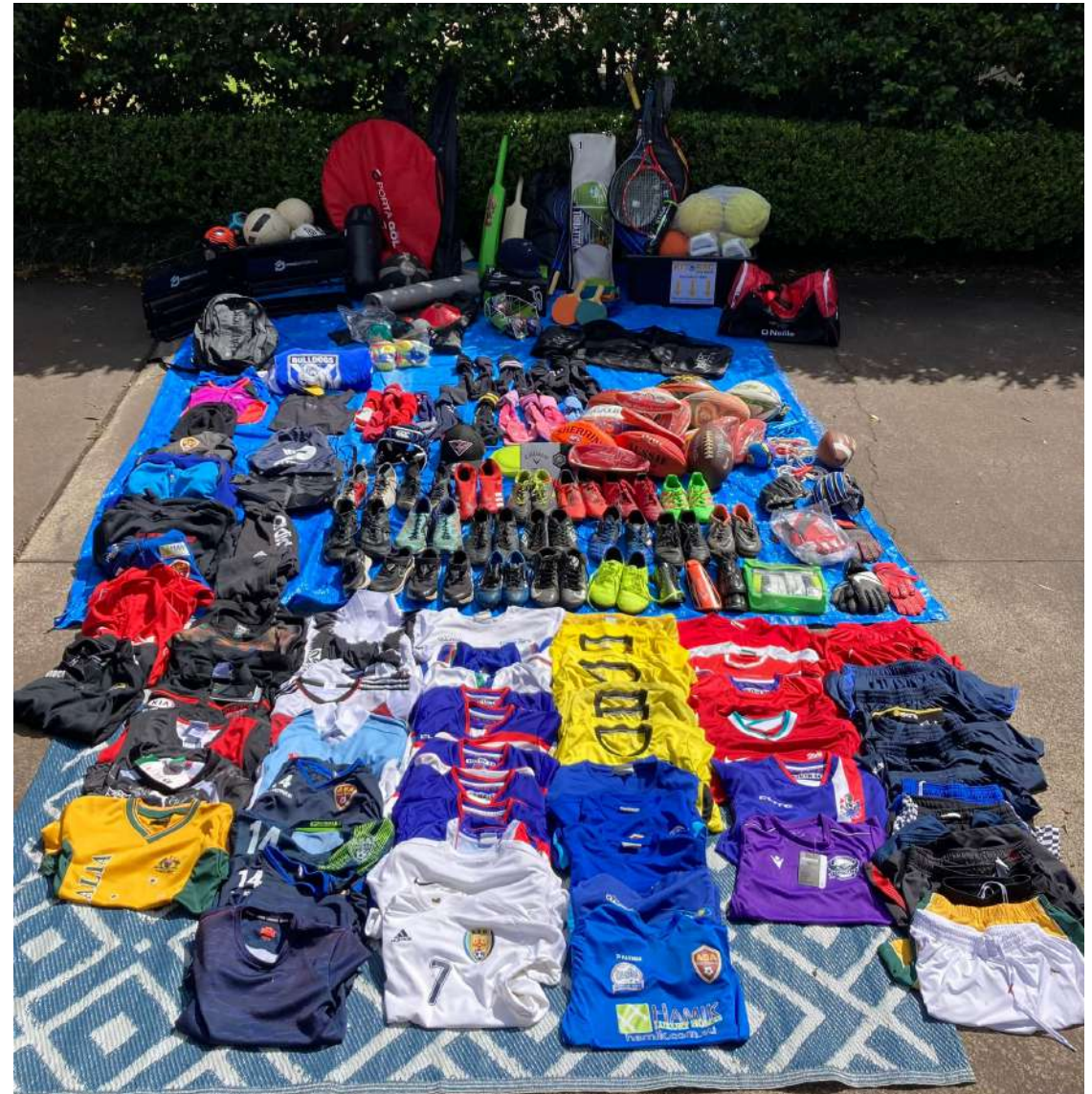

2023 Overview

It was another year of significant activity. From our operation in the eastern suburbs of Sydney we redistributed a quite remarkable **14,790 items of sports clothing, footwear and equipment to disadvantaged kids across Australia.**

The year involved working on familiar projects such as the NSW Active Fest alongside NSW Office of Sport and Creative Community Concepts as well as some exciting new opportunities such as the PCYC Nations of Origin, and Ronny Gibbs Rugby in Dubbo. We continued to work closely with some fantastic people in East and West Arnhem regional councils, down at Wreck Bay and NT Government. Great people doing great things for kids and going that extra mile.

We also coordinated with a number of other charities and community groups who kindly distributed our sportswear to the kids they support including Isolated Children and Parents Association, Red Dust, 54 Reasons and Sunnyfield Disability Services. It is satisfying to continue to be involved with schools and individuals in their endeavors to keep kids engaged in sport. Schools supported across the country included Mornington Island State School, One Arm Point, Owairtilla, Milingimbi, Mainsbridge, Cunnamulla, Alekarenge, Kinchela, Yipirinya and Warruwi.

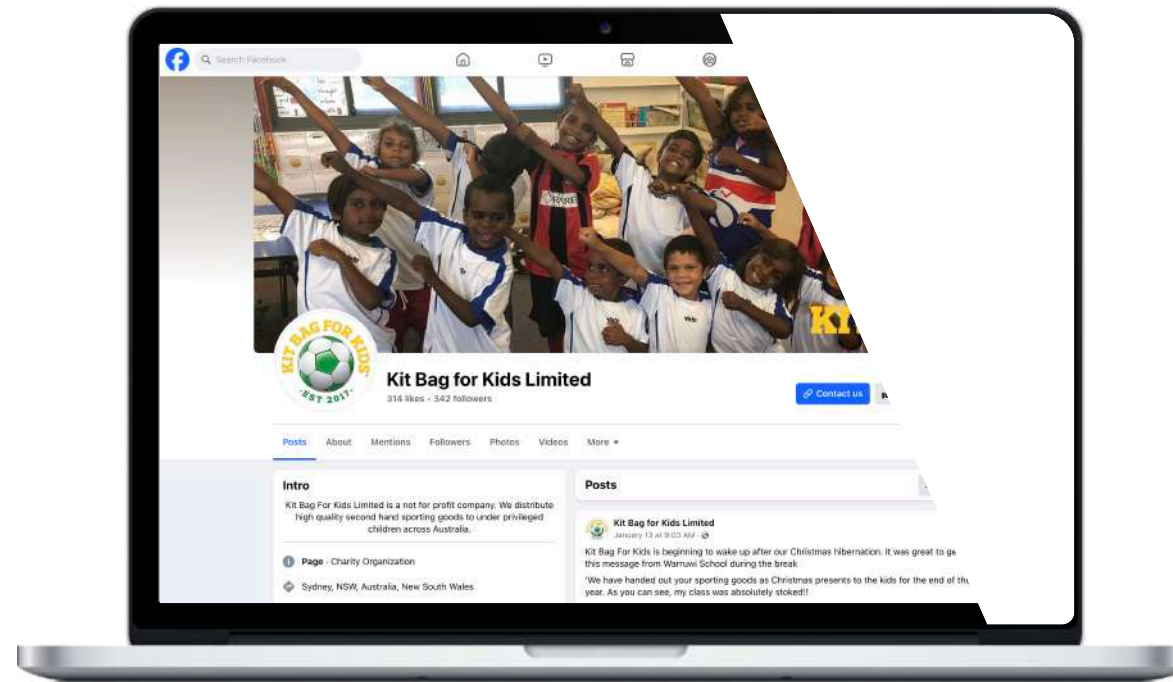
